

Painted Handprint Cards



MATERIALS:

- Cardstock paper
- kid-friendly paint
- Sponge brush or paintbrush

DIRECTIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION PAPER HANDS:

1. You can cut your paper in half to make a one-sided card, or you can fold it in half to make a regular card.
2. Put a thick layer of wet paint on the child's hand.
3. Place the painted hand on the page, and gently press the hand down to make sure the paint transfers to the paper. Lift the hand straight up when finished. Repeat this process for each hand flower.
4. Use a paintbrush or sponge brush to paint the stem and leaves.
5. Sign your name on the card.
6. If you make a card that opens to an inside page, make sure to include something on the inside.



Construction Paper Handprint Cards



MATERIALS:

- Cardstock paper
- Construction paper
- Scissors (optional)
- Glue
- Pencil to trace hand on construction paper

DIRECTIONS:

1. You can cut your paper in half to make a one-sided card, or you can fold it in half to make a regular card.
2. Trace the child's hand on the construction paper.
3. Cut the hand out of the construction paper using the line you traced as a guide.
4. Cut a strip of paper out for the stem of the flower.
5. Cut out two pieces to use as leaves. (See template on the next page)
6. Glue the stem and the leaves on first. (near the bottom of the card)
7. Glue the hand onto the top of the stem.
8. Sign your name on the card.
9. If you make a card that opens to an inside page, make sure to include something on the inside.
